

Child Safeguarding Statement

This Child Safeguarding Statement has been developed in line with requirements under the Children First Act 2015, *Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children* (2017), and Tusla's *Child Safeguarding: A Guide for Policy, Procedure and Practice*

Name of service: Southwest Community Intervention Teams Ltd (Southwest CIT)

Nature of service and principles to safeguard children from harm:

Southwest CIT is an enhanced nurse led service in the community supported by a variety of other healthcare professionals and community services. CIT is based in the SouthDoc Treatment Centre, South Ring Business Park, Kinsale Road and from a number of treatment centres located in Cork County. CIT also provides services in a patient's own home or community setting. During the period of CIT intervention, Clinical Governance for the patient is retained by the referring clinician. Southwest CIT is committed to safeguarding children while they attend our service and to fulfilling its obligations by implementing and complying with the Children's First Act 2015. As an organisation we are obliged to:

- Keep children safe from harm
- Complete a risk assessment
- Prepare this safeguarding statement
- Appoint a relevant person

Under the Child Care Act 1991, the definition of a child is anyone under the age of 18 who is not married.

Risk Assessment

This risk assessment has evaluated safeguarding risk of potential harm to a child from abuse while attending our service. It does not include risks to general health and safety.

Harm is as defined by the Children First Act 2015 (Sections 11(1) (a) and Section 2), in relation to a child as

- (a) assault, ill-treatment or neglect of the child in a manner that seriously affects or is likely to seriously affect the child's health, development or welfare or
- (b) sexual abuse of the child, whether caused by a single act, omission or circumstance or a combination of acts, omissions or circumstances, or otherwise.

Safeguarding risks will be outlined in the context of the following elements of service provision

- Treatment Centre Visits
- Home Visits

Identified Key Risks

- Risk of harm to a child from a staff member
- Risk of harm to a child from another person attending the service
- Risk of harm or concerns not being recognised or reported by staff
